## What to look for when searching for an apartment?

Take a moment before you decide. A home is not just about square metres and the number of rooms; it's a part of your daily life, your sense of security, and well-being. We'll help you look deeper – how the building is built, what the surroundings are like, and how the home supports your lifestyle.

This simple thought exercise will help you make an informed, well-considered and confident choice.

# General impression and building characteristics When was the building constructed? What materials are used in the building's load-bearing structures? What is the building's energy rating? Does the building have solar panels or other energy-efficient solutions? How are the water supply and sewage systems organised in the apartment building? Does the building have video surveillance, an intercom or a security system? Location and living environment Is the location convenient for your daily routines and movements? How far are your and/or your family members' workplaces, schools, kindergartens, shops, services, and public transport stops? Is there nature nearby and are there safe walking paths? Is the neighbourhood generally pleasant and family-friendly? Are there opportunities for sports and leisure activities in the area (both indoors and

outdoors)?

### Surroundings of the house and accessibility Is the area surrounding the building tidy, landscaped, and ready? Are there green areas, playgrounds or other opportunities for exercise nearby? Is it convenient for guests to park their car? Is the building easily accessible with a wheelchair or stroller? Is there a lift? Are the staircases finished to a high standard, and designed to feel comfortable, and pleasant? Condition of the apartment On which floor is the apartment located? Is the layout logical and functional? Are the interior finishing materials of high quality and to your taste? Can the interior finishing options still be changed? How is the apartment positioned in relation to the movement of the sun? Does the apartment receive enough daylight? What are the views of the apartment? What are the estimated monthly utility costs (in winter and summer)? What is the apartment's ventilation system like? Does the apartment have cooling or the option to install it? Does the apartment have underfloor heating? In which rooms? Are the windows and doors of high quality and in line with your expectations? Are the windows double- or triple-glazed? Are the bathroom walls made of stone or plasterboard? Does the apartment have a balcony, terrace or loggia? How are the electrical and low-voltage systems arranged? How many power sockets are there, and where are they located? Storage space Does your apartment include a storage space? Is the storage space big enough? Can it hold, for example, an adult's bicycle? Is there lift access to where the storage spaces are? Are there electrical outlets in the storage spaces? If so, how many?
